W the sacrificial altar, the High Priest had to inspect the animal throu any itch, scab, disease or broken bones before he laid his hands upo run his hands through the hair of the animal to make sure that it w had to examine the animal meticulously before it was ready for th commentator, the priests had to even open the mouth of the shee were intact. “ When a bullock, or a sheep, or a goat, is brought for under the dam; and from the eighth day and thenceforth it shall be by fire unto the LORD.” (Leviticus 22:27) The animals were not cons till the 8th day according to some scholars. The priest used to keep and quarantine for ten days.
